## Recycling Notes:



Starting June 1, 2011 recycling will be picked up on a weekly basis. Week one will be for the collection of fiber items which include:

### Newspaper/Magazines/Catalogues and Phone Books

- Includes advertising inserts and glossy flyers
- White, brown or coloured writing & mailing papers
- Photocopy paper & envelopes (no carbon tissue)

*Keep newspaper separate from cardboard .*

*Put shredded paper in clear bags.*

### Corrugated Cardboard

- Layered cardboard boxes with ripple between layers

*Place beside blue box flattened & bundled (30" x 30" x 8")*

### Boxboard

- Cereal, detergent, shoe boxes etc. Remove liners.

*Cardboard & boxboard can be placed together.*

Week two will be for the collection of commingled items which include:

### Glass Bottles & Jars

- Clear & coloured food & beverage containers only

*Remove lids and place in garbage.*

### Metal Food & Beverage Containers

- Steel & aluminum food & beverage cans
- Aluminum foil trays

*Jar lids can be placed with metal food products . Rinse lids and place in blue box.*

### Plastic Bottles & Jars

- Containers through  marked

*No Styrofoam peanuts or packing Styrofoam.*

The Township is pleased to officially open the recreation facility on **May 28th, 2011 at 2 P.M.** There will be a short ribbon cutting ceremony and dessert and coffee to follow. Join us at the recreation facility as we honour the memory of two brave men.

On September 18, 2006 while serving in Afghanistan both soldiers were killed in the line of duty.

Cpl. Arnold was born in Sudbury and raised in McKerrow, Ontario, where his loving parents George and Leona reside. He bravely served his country for 14 years during which he deployed to Bosnia-Herzegovina, as a member of DART in Sri Lanka and one previous deployment to Afghanistan. In addition to being a dedicated soldier, we will first and foremost remember Glen as a dedicated son, father and a loving husband. Glen left behind his wife and four children.

Pte. Byers was born in Espanola. He was the middle child born to Jane and John Byers. David chose to join the Infantry that led him to Shilo Manitoba to continue his training. David became a proud member of the Second Battalion Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry in June of 2004. At battle school in Shilo he earned the Top Shot award for his marksmanship which was a proud moment for him. David left behind his fiancé and his unborn child. On March 2, 2007 his daughter was born.

It is with great humility that we dedicate this building to the memory of two brave young men along with all veterans past present and future who give their lives in service of this country.
